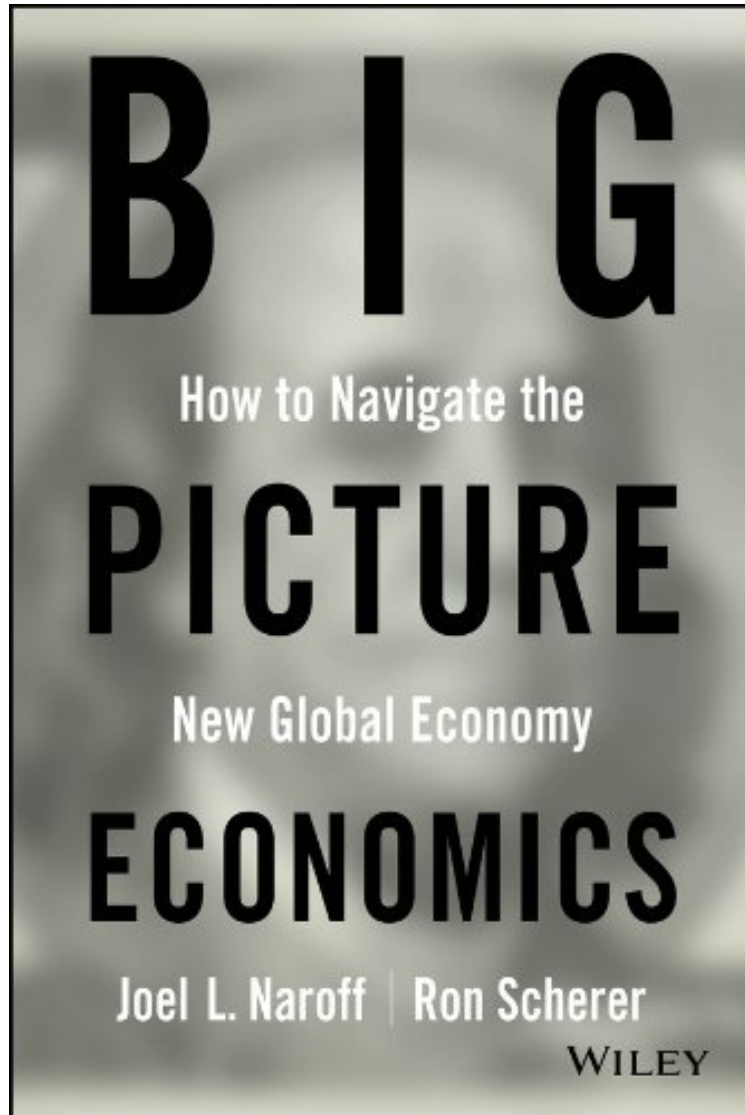

It's for everyone else who wants to make sense of the world because, after all, most everything boils down to money in the end anyway. After *Big Picture Economics*, you'll more completely understand what you read in the paper and online as well as better comprehend your own buying decisions. A word of warning—don't be dissuaded by the typeface and layout when you open the book. The print, font and layout make *Big Picture* appear more like a dry textbook than a great read—but those misconceptions fade as you start turning pages.
