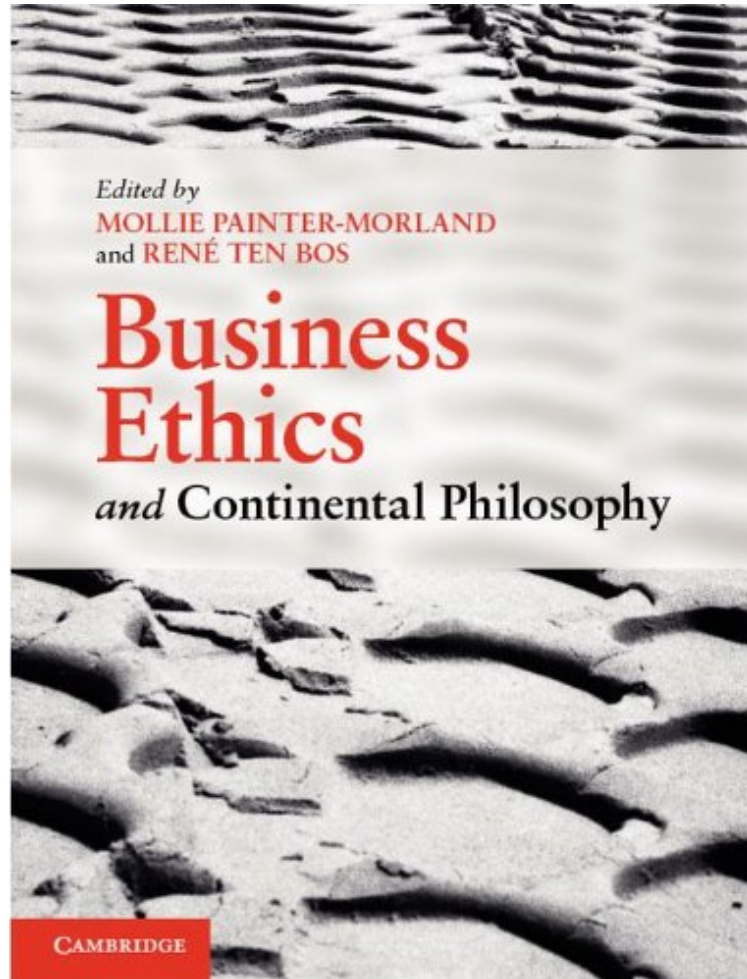

The chapters written by Mollie Painter-Morland, one of the editors, are particularly heinous. Painter-Morland excessively uses philosophic jargon while hardly ever defining her terms, and makes a pathetic attempt, at best, to bring the topic back around to the connections between her continental vomit and the actual subject of the chapter.
