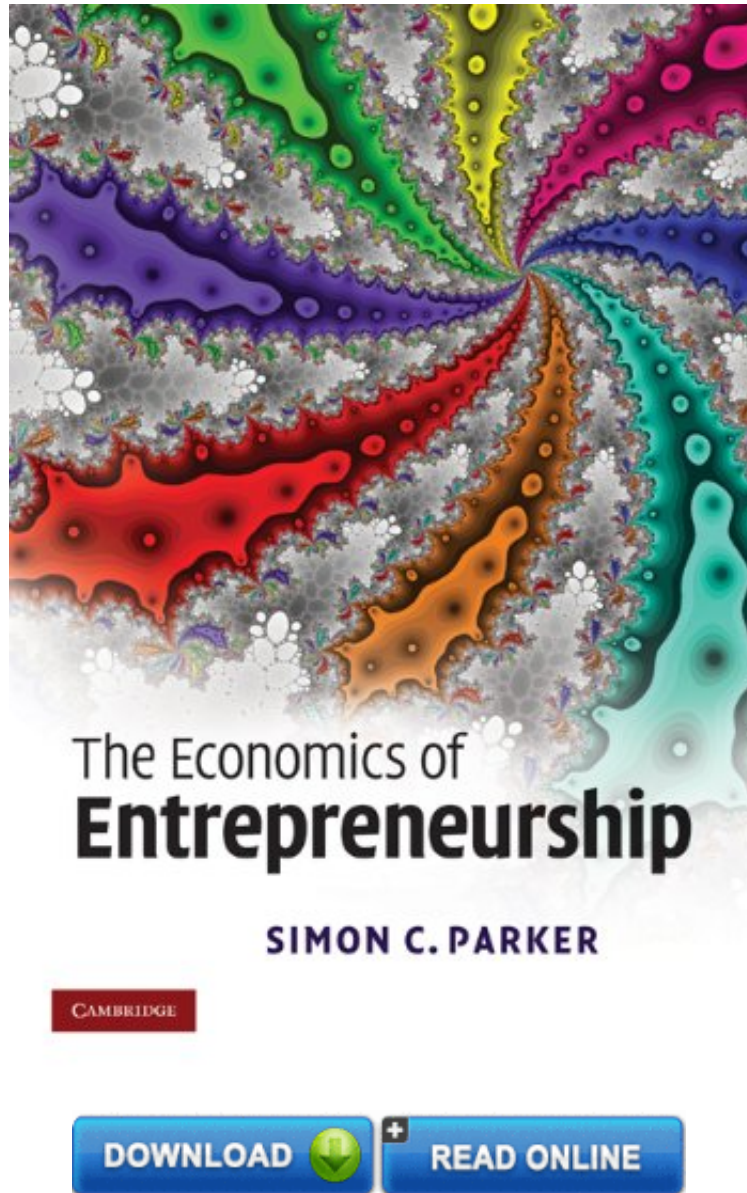


The Economics of Entrepreneurship
